### Legal aid: electronic paypoint




On 18 August 2000 an informal ceremony was held in the boardroom of the Johannesburg Bar to launch the new electronic system of payment of accounts for Legal Aid work. Present at the ceremony were the Minister of Justice, Dr Penuell Maduna (centre), the chairman of the Legal Aid Board, Judge Mohamed Navsa (left), the chairman of the Johannesburg Bar Council, Nazeer Cassim SC (right). The ceremony was also attended by representatives and members of the board, the General Council of the Bar and the Johannesburg Bar.

## Aan medewerkers

Under the new system of payment accounts are submitted to the Johannesburg office of the board, which processes them expeditiously through the head office in Pretoria, so that practitioners are paid within one week of the submission of their accounts. At the ceremony the first of such cheques were presented to members of the Johannesburg Bar. At present the system is only in operation in Johannesburg, but Judge Navsa stated that it was to be extended to other centres, starting with Durban in the near future.

The Minister in his address expressed his appreciation for the effort put in by Judge Navsa in tackling

the difficult task of re-ordering and updating the administration of the board. Minister Maduna confirmed his commitment to the provision of legal aid to the indigent by the State. Judge Navsa said that the administration of the board and its financial status had so improved that an increase in fees next year was anticipated.

Among those attending the ceremony who have consistently contributed to assist the board in its work were Roland Sutherland SC and Halima Saldulker of the GCB, Paul Pretorius SC and Mrs Ina Mundell of the Johannesburg Bar, and Philippa Kruger of the board.
