

Opportunities at London and Paris Bars

Discussions between the GCB and the Bar of England and Wales have led to an exciting new opportunity for new practitioners.

GCB chair Jeremy Gauntlett SC has been informed by Linda Dobbs QC, a criminal specialist and chair of the Professional Standards Committee (she is a leading counsel for the Serious Fraud Office in a number of criminal prosecutions) that the general management committee of her chambers has approved a three – month award for a promising member of a South African Bar.

The award – a pilot scheme – will entail a grant of 750 per month plus airfare. A varied programme (with time spent with various members in chambers, working with a judge or two, and with time spent in solicitors' offices).

The first award is contemplated for the last quarter of this year.

Applications should be directed **by 30 April 2002** to the Secretary of the General Council of the Bar at **gcb@cis.co.za** marked "London Bar Award". These should include: a *curriculum vitae*; three references; and a short statement as to why the applicant believes he / she is suitable.

A person with good academic background, in the first five years of practice, strong commitment to a career at the Bar and leadership potential will be preferred. An interest in criminal law, human rights and international law is a recommendation.

Conference in Durban 20-25 October 2002

Since 1988, the IBA's Section on Business Law has provided scholarships to over 350 young lawyers worldwide. A scholarship covers the cost of registration fees and travel to attend IBA conferences.
